

### LETTERFOURIE PARK UPGRADE

Letterfourie Park, just off Netherha Road, will receive a £50k revamp next year as part of rolling programme of improvements across Moray's parks.

Moray Council officers have already been engaging with people in the local community about what they would like to see, and a group of enthusiastic residents have been supporting by attending meetings, helping to design a survey and promoting a recent popup in the park to gather information on what people would like to see. This is an ideal opportunity for local people to get involved in deciding how the council invests in the park and more than 150 people have already filled out the survey. ### HARBOUR NEWS

It's an exciting time for Buckie with the Moray West offshore wind project well under way. Changes include construction of a new office for the lead organisation Ocean Winds which will house around 60 staff. Other changes include construction of a new Harbour Office as well as developing existing infrastructure. ## £25K INVESTMENT ENCOURAGES RESIDENTS TO GET ON THEIR BIKE!

Since the start of the year Moray Council's Active Travel team has been asking locals where they would like to see cycle parking, cycle shelters and repair stations in and around the area that would encourage people to get on their bikes. Officers at the council were extremely grateful for the support they received from a residents' steering group to promote the project and check over proposals. Ideas were suggested and after 163 votes were cast the £25k budget has been allocated to the following projects. Look out for them on a street near you!

- 1. Cluny Square, South East side Bike shaped cycle with integrated rack & bike repair station with wheel holder and toolkit, separate pump stand.
- 2. Marchmont Business Centre Toaster style bicycle rack
- 3. Buckie Community Centre/High School Bike repair station, with wheel holder, and toolkit and separate pump stand.
- 4. Strathlene (below Golf Course)
  Sheffield style bicycle stand with tapping bar.
  Bike repair station with wheel holder and toolkit, separate pump stand.
- 5. Buckpool Harbour Sheffield style bicycle stand with tapping bar.

### THE SECRET GARDEN

The Secret Garden project at The Hub has been a great success. As part of the Culture Collective programme organised through Findhorn Bay Arts, artists Jo and Robbie delivered a variety of practical workshops in the garden at The Hub. People of all ages took part and created a variety of lovely objects, including painted stones, posh bee hotels, woven willow bird feeders and a large array of cyanotype photo prints. Hub volunteers worked hard to get the garden into shape for these events, and the positive relationship built with Jo and Robbie means that further projects are being explored. ### **BUCKIE HIGH**

The pupils from SFL Dept. have been busy. We applied for "Back on our Feet" funding and successfully raised £3000 to build a Polytunnel. Support for the project from local volunteer group the Men's Shed provided the necessary input to help finish up the interior in time for our official Opening Ceremony on June 19th. We had a Coffee morning and Afternoon tea so friends, families our local community partners and businesses could meet our young people and have an opportunity to see the new Polytunnel. The ladies from Hays Travel forged a link with our PT Geography Dept. and the Travel & Tourism course that is being run for our pupils which has strengthened our relationship with industry partners.

The pupils received their Department Awards from Mrs Moira Taylor our Deputy Head during the Afternoon Tea, in front of proud parents, grandparents, families and friends to celebrate their achievements.

Since April, we have attended the Community Lunches at the Fisherman's Hall where the young people have experienced meeting and talking to new people, trying different foods and improving their social skills. They have met the volunteers and are due to have the opportunity to assist with the lunch at the end of October.

The Buckie & District Community Council have very kindly given us a cheque for £250 to help us get tools and equipment for working in the Polytunnel and the Health Improvement Fund application was successful and awarded us a further £1000 to purchase larger items like a water collection system, hose, wheel barrow, PPE, tools, composter and more. This has proved invaluable to us to get the project up and running. The school is now a RHS member and currently delivering a wider achievement award for our S1/ S2 pupils.

### AN UPDATE FROM MORAY PATHWAYS LOCAL EMPLOYABILITY PARTNERSHIP - BUCKIE

The partnership network have been very busy supporting residents of all ages in Buckie area. They have supported a total of 109 people, this includes 61 adults aged 25 plus, 43 young people and 5 parents in poverty.

This has included training with organisations such as the Social Enterprise Academy, Enable Works, UHI Moray Employability Team and Elgin Youth Development Group. Recently in Buckie Moray Pathways have offered:

- Specialist courses eg Chivas Manufacturing for those who wish to work in the distillery industry
- Drop in digital sessions at The Hub
- · A jobs fair in the job centre
- A volunteer marketplace in the Buckie Baptist Church Hall
- Personal support sessions are available to help those preparing for work
